"Limited Attention in Audit Partners: Negative Spillover Effects of New Clients on an Audit Partner's Portfolio" Solo-Authored Dissertation

• Auditing a new client requires immense attention to make up for a lack of client-specific knowledge. Using accepting a new client as a change to audit partner attention, I find the firms whose partner accepts a new engagement experience higher absolute abnormal accruals, lower working capital accruals quality, and a larger audit report lag. This effect is only present when the new client was previously audited by a different audit firm. This study informs regulators and audit firms of an unintended consequence of auditor rotation.

"The Long-Term Effects of Turnover: Evidence from College Football Head Coaches" Co-Authored with Will Demere

• We examine the long-term effects of executive turnover and factors that moderate this relationship. Extending the disruption perspective of turnover, we provide evidence in support of substantial disruption costs around turnover, and we show that the negative effects of turnover are more pronounced and have a longer duration following involuntary turnover. Additional tests show that replacements with certain characteristics can partially offset the negative long-term effects of turnover by reducing disruption costs and information asymmetry.

ACADEMIC RESEARCH IN PROGRESS

"External Pressures and Incomplete Information: Long-Term Performance Following Forced CEO Turnover" Project with Will Demere

• The Board of Directors face several external pressures to respond to poor firm performance. They also have incomplete information about the skill of the current CEO and the suitability of potential future replacements. We theorize that the pressures to make a change combined with a lack of information will lead the Board of Directors to make suboptimal CEO turnover decisions. Consistent with this theory, evidence shows that firms experience worse long-term performance following performance-related forced CEO turnover.

"Determinants and Consequences of Risk Factor Disclosure Changes" Project with Keith Czerney

• Little is known about what drives firm-level risk factor disclosures. We create a new measure that proxies for changes in firm risk factor disclosures in Item 1A of 10-Ks. We study what firm-level and macro-level events cause firms to alter their significant risk factors.
